JUSTICE DEPARTMENT GRANT SOLICITATION FOR FUNDING TO FEDERALLY-RECOGNIZED TRIBES AND TRIBAL CONSORTIA

The U.S. Department of Justice announced that the comprehensive grant solicitation for funding to support improvements to public safety, victim services and crime prevention in American Indian and Alaska Native communities is available at:

www.justice.gov/tribal/open-sol.html. A total of more than \$101.4 million is available through the Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 Coordinated Tribal Assistance Solicitation (CTAS) and is



administered by the Office of Justice Programs (OJP), the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) and the Office on

Violence Against Women (OVW). This funding can be used to conduct comprehensive planning, enhance law enforcement, bolster justice systems, support and enhance tribal efforts to prevent and control delinquency and strengthen the juvenile justice system, prevent youth substance abuse, serve sexual assault and elder victims, and support other efforts to combat crimes.
